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SECTION 1 FAKE NEWS

HOW HAVE SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS CHANGED THE WAY WE CONSUME AND UNDERSTAND INFORMATION?

I think that when big influencers post something publicly, (sometimes) it can be extremely biased. Things like politics and such are topics where bias is prominent. LASTLY, I FIND THAT I CAN MEET MORE PEOPLE ONLINE, AS THERE ISN'T ANY PHYSICAL RESTRAINT TO WHO I CAN INTERACT WITH.

HOW IS SOCIAL MEDIA AND SOCIAL CAPITAL HELPING TO FORM YOUTH CULTURE?

Social media is forming youth culture because influencers are on social media platforms, who effect the actions of youth. Social capital is important to youth culture because adults have to teach the next generation good morals, leadership, etc. It also helps people to work together if they all have similar norms, trust and values. One of the downsides to social capital, however, is that it may suppress any innovation, as it can restrict people's thoughts to the social norms they were taught.

DO YOU SEE ANY SIMILARITIES BETWEEN THE WORLD PRESENTED IN THIS VIDEO AND THE WORLD YOU LIVE IN?

THIS STATUS ON SOCIAL MEDIA ALSO CARRIES OVER INTO THE REAL WORLD, WHICH CAN AFFECT ONE'S PERSONAL LIFE.

HOW DOES THE MAIN CHARACTER GAIN AND LOSE POINTS? WHY ARE THESE POINTS IMPORTANT TO HER?

When she and the person working with her were gossiping about the other man breaking up, some people may have heard it and consequentially, her rating went down. I think that these "points" are so important to her because if she has too few of them, then everything in her life with go down south. Also, it seems that everyone living in this society seems to have grown up with this notion that "these points mean everything in life", so it makes sense that she would care so much, as this rating can affect her life on such a personal level. Because she understands that these points determines everything in her life, she has to fake her life and her mood everyday.
